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WHO WE ARE



Established in 2012, Nasaem Khair has strived to alleviate the suffering of the Syrian-afflicted people right from the beginning of the Syrian Crisis in order to save and relieve those most affected by the conflict. Nasaem started as an integrated team working tirelessly to bring back students to their demolished schools, to feed families that are unable to secure a loaf of bread, and to condole individuals afflicted with grief and loss. For this, we have gathered a mission of relief, development, and education.

Nasaem Khair was registered in Turkey in October 2015 with a registration number of 27-019-014. Since then, Nasaem Khair has provided humanitarian aid in various sectors: Food Security and Livelihood, Shelter and Non-food Items, Education, Early Recovery, WASH, Health, Nutrition and Protection. We believe that humanitarian aid should be provided to people in need regardless of their language, sex, race, or nationality. Aid is to be prioritized solely based on need. Equally, we believe that aid will not be used to further a particular standpoint. Nasaem has been implementing sustainable programs that improve access to the most vulnerable families to immediate, life-saving assistance and long-term recovery to increase opportunities for future generations and strengthen the host and internally displaced persons' resilience.





WHY NORTHWEST SYRIA? A LOOK 'BACK INTO THE PRESENT TIME'

Sadly, 2020 marked a decade of conflict in Syria that has resulted in over half a million people killed or missing, and more than half of the country's population being displaced. Years of brutal war have undermined Syrians' ability to cope with the latest challenges brought about by COVID-19 and exacerbated the economic crisis. Many civilians have been left living in perpetual conflict zones and displaced multiple times.

The northwestern region of Syria in the year 2020 was exposed to all kinds of injustice, persecution, deprivation, and suffering that affected the population in the region greatly, as people suffered from poverty, hunger, ignorance, disease, and the lack of the minimum necessities of life, so it was necessary for us to strongly continue in all fields to help these innocent people, provide them with a decent life, and work to advance them again at all levels, material and moral aspects, and support them to continue in these difficult circumstances in which they live, to build their own better future.



HOW WE WORK

NEEDS BASED

Our approach to programs is one that is built on listening to the local communities, accountability to affected population and identifying their needs through various assessment tools including key informant interviews, focus group discussions and sample surveys.

STRONG PROGRAM DESIGN

The next step is ensuring a strong program design whereby the Programs unit takes the identified gaps and creates a program that aims to address the root causes of these needs.

QUALITY IMPLEMENTATION

We placed a concerted effort in building the capacity of all staff, including those on the front line. The experience of the staff has contributed to their ability to implement projects with high quality, ensuring the integration of key stakeholders and in line with humanitarian principles.

POLICIES AND STANDARD OPERATING

Procedures: The program operates within policies developed based on the requirements of each sector. Each of these policies follows the standard operating procedures, which explain the mechanism of work within the departments in detail, in addition to the roles and responsibilities of those within the department.

MONITORING, EVALUATION, ACCOUNTABILITY AND LEARNING (MEAL)

Through this function, we are able to monitor the outputs of programs and measure their impact throughout baseline and endless assessments. It also provides access to beneficiaries to give their feedback and complaints. Our MEAL unit allow us to learn lessons from previous projects and apply them moving forward in order to strengthen our future programming.

INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT

The program works to support community resilience and civil society organizations by implementing joint projects, programs, and workshops.

WHAT WE DO FOR ALL PEOPLE

In the year 2020, several projects, campaigns and emergency responses were implemented in various work sectors, the number of households reached 72,182 families who benefited from the projects throughout the year. Thus, the number of beneficiaries is 397982 and number of internally displaced persons (IDPs) is 255813. Which includes the following beneficiary classifications:



FOOD SECURITY & LIVELIHOOD (FSL)


Over the last eight years, Nasaem has been listening to the affected population's needs and adopted a holistic approach to service provision to ensure the complementarity of services, projects. Based on that, Nasaem has distributed an enormous number of food baskets, nutritional and supplementary food items, cooked meals and RTEs to hundreds of thousands of beneficiaries greatly affected by war, displacement and conflict. Furthermore, Nasaem has supported wheat flour to bakeries and a considerable number of fresh bread packs to those who need it most in multiple areas in Idleb governorate.




Eighth Kurban Project: distribution of supplementary food items (Meat) for 4560 Families in (Ariha, Harim & Jisr-Ashoughour) district.

EDUCATION

Our core strategy is to get as many children and students as we can back into school and give them a chance to shape their future.

Nasaem is running four education projects in Syria in 2020, the number of beneficiaries reached 1189, in a full support manner helping many children stay in school. The projects supported are scattered in many districts in Idleb governorates such as Ariha, Jisr-Ash Shugur. Nasaem supports the projects by operational costs of schools to ensure that students receive a quality education. This includes salaries, provision of supplies and stationery, utilities, awards for students, heating materials, and distribution of NFI and clothing kits. Besides, we provide essential training to improve learning outcomes and student well-being and bolstering the schools' management and teachers' performances.

Moreover, we have delivered services such as distributing NFI items and clothing kits to several educational centres and schools to encourage them to continue learning.



NASAEM DISTINCTIVE SCHOOL: in Ariha district, the education service was provided to households / families, and the number of beneficiaries reached about 155, 126 of whom were males over +18 years old and 29 males under -18 years old.

AL-GHAFR SCHOOL FOR BASIC EDUCATION: in Jisr-Ash Shugur sub district, the education service was provided to households / families, and the number of beneficiaries reached about 607, 287 of whom were females under -18 years old, and 320 males under -18 years old.

ALKASTAN HIGH SCHOOL: in Jisr-Ash Shugur sub district, the education service was provided to households / families, and the number of beneficiaries reached about 232, 131 of whom were females over +18 years old, and 101 males over +18 years old.

ALKASTAN SECONDARY SCHOOL: in Jisr-Ash Shugur sub district, the education service was provided to households / families, and the number of beneficiaries reached about 195, all were males under -18 years old.




HEALTH


Nasaem has been operating the health care center (Polyclinic) in Ariha district to deliver comprehensive medical services, including the most important specialties such as GP clinic, CNS clinic, ENT, orthopedic, pediatric, ophthalmic, dentistry, physiotherapy, laboratory, radiological department, Psychosocial Support PSS, case management and pharmacy, providing a qualified medical service for chronic and acute patients. In 2020 the number of beneficiaries of the medical center services reached 15,291 people (Men, women, children, and the elderly) from the city of Ariha and its countryside as follows

3865 males over +18, 3564 females over +18, 5346 males under -18, 2516 females under -18. Distributed to different polyclinics.

EARLY RECOVERY AND LIVELIHOOD (MULTI-PURPOSE CASH MPC)

Nasaem has been providing grants to vulnerable community groups who have faced great losses so they can start rebuilding. Our cash interventions target those who are most in need prioritizing female-headed, elderly-headed, disabled persons and children.

ORPHAN SPONSORSHIP PROJECT #1-2: distributing the monthly cash assistance along with conducting recurrent sessions including PSS to treat those who are traumatized as a result of protracted war (orphan sponsorship) throughout the year for 739 families in Idlib Governorate, Ariha district and Jisr-Ash Shugur district.





Sabiha, 29 years, she was living with her parents in Ariha. since birth she had suffered from a physical disability.

however, her disability conditions did not deter her from studying, she choose the department of "laboratory technician" which through she would help patients.

She had joined the family of Nasaem Khair and has started working in the middle of 2020, she was working hard to serve the patients, as she was meeting the patients with a smile and bided them farewell with the same, she was doing her job with dedication and sincerity.

Her colleagues were accustomed to the scenes of patients were leaving the laboratory every day, by out loud they were praying for her blessings and longevity to express their gratitude and satisfaction.

Good manner and gentle smile have a great impact on the hearts of patients who have been exhausted by illness so they had need of a kind word and a touch of tenderness that relieves them of pain and gives them hope.

Sabiha told us that despair managed to infiltrate her heart and she felt a sense of loss of hope at times in the past, which almost made her lose her passion and reluctance to continue. Since starting her work in the health care center in the city of Ariha, her life has changed radically, as she began to see life with optimism and hope

She added: "Do not despair, just be patient and continue, as continuity in striving means the inevitability of reaching."
